WELCOME TO A SAILING PARADISE

The azure waters of the Mediterranean, the Aegean, and the Black Sea, as well as the Sea of Marmara, surround Turkey to the south, west and north.



With over 8,333 kilometers of coastline along the four seas, Turkey is a treasure chest of coves, inlets, bays and beaches at which yachtsmen can choose a different and private anchorage each night. The sailing paradise of Turkey is also home to the Blue Voyage. This idyllic cruise means sailing with the winds, into coves and over the seas and becoming one with nature. It is also an experience of the history of man from the perspective of the sea rather than from the land, a journey which carries you to the private beach of Cleopatra, the eternal fires of remains of ancient civilizations. For lovers of the active life, sailing in clear waters provides great opportunities for swimming, fishing, skiing, surfing and diving.

Sailing in Turkey also allows you to experience a truly enriching cultural exchange with the hospitable and gracious people of the coastal villages and towns. The tempered winds which generally blow from the west and northwest make the long summers ideal for yachting, and seem to encourage an appreciation of nature. From some of the turquoise coast's unspoilt and sheltered bays you can see mountain peaks rising to almost 3,000 meters above sea level.

In Turkey modern facilities and comfort have not overshadowed ancient hospitality and the slower pace of life. The pleasure of yachting in Turkey will tempt you to come back again and again, to explore yet another stretch of coast and to relive the luxurious ease of life on the sea.

MARINAS

Over the past 40 years the industry has grown, and today a large number of marinas dot the coastline between Istanbul and Antalya. These provide supplies, easy access to the shore at major resorts and safe harbors, as well as often becoming local entertainment venues in themselves. In Istanbul, yachtsmen will delight in splendid natural landscapes, open seas and magnificent sunsets, as well as a voyage through Byzantine and Ottoman history as they sail past the impressive castles, palaces and mosques. While navigating the breathtaking Bosphorus and sailing under the two enormous bridges which span Europe and Asia, meandering along the mosque-lined Golden Horn or cruising in the coves and bays of the Princes' Islands, you can always return to one of the two large marinas in the area. Both Ataköy Marina on the European side and Kalamış - Fenerbahçe (Amiral Fahri Korutürk) Marina on the Asian side offer 24-hour service. From the North Sea through

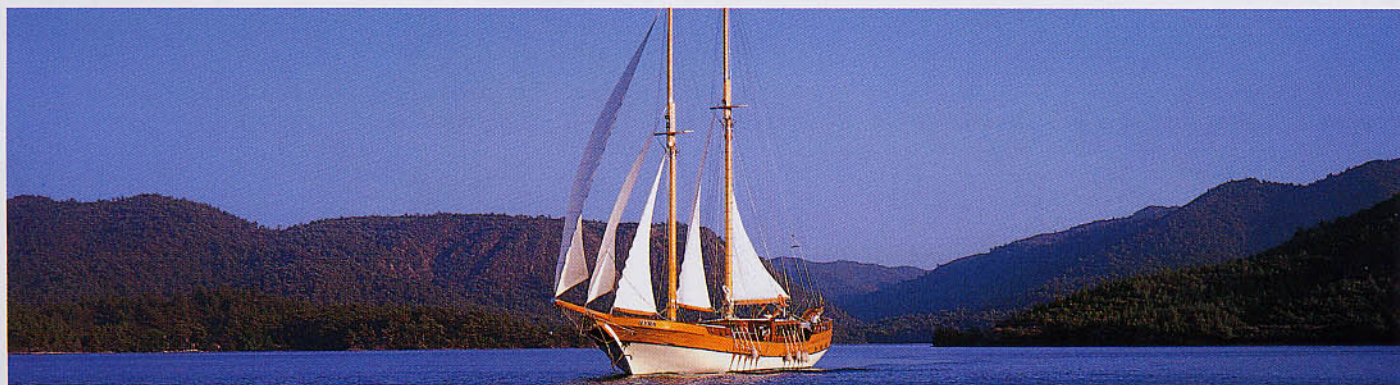
the European interior, yachtsmen can sail down the European channel system and the Rhine and Danube Rivers into the Black Sea harbors and to the Istanbul Bosphorus and Istanbul marinas - a safe and short way to get to the Turkish coasts. The Black Sea coast provides yachtsmen with a lush green coastal band where the environment is well-protected. There are coves and fishing harbors along this coast, and the weather is mild during the summer and winter.

Turkey's most established marinas lie on the southern Aegean and Mediterranean coasts at İzmir, Çeşme, Kuşadası, Bodrum, Ayvalık, Mersin, Datça, Bozburun, Marmaris, Göcek, Fethiye, Kalkan, Kaş, Finike, Kemer and Antalya. In these well-equipped harbors, yachtsmen can find the services and provisions they require. Antalya, Bodrum, Dalaman, İzmir and Istanbul airports provide quick links to all of Turkey's marinas. After an easy flight you can board your yacht and sail off all within a day.

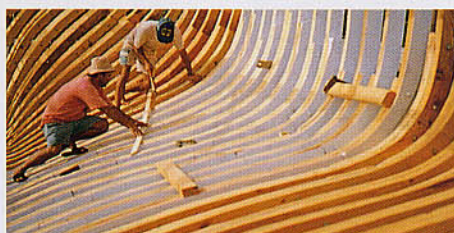


GULETTES: ENJOYMENT ON TRADITIONAL CRAFTS

The singular design of Turkey's indigenous sea-going vessel, the gulette, blends practicality and tradition in a relaxed style that embodies the Blue Voyage.



Over the years gulettes have evolved from traditional fishing and cargo vessels into their present profile of a broad beam and wide deck. Constructed mainly in the shipyards of Bodrum, Bozburun, Marmaris and Istanbul, and along the Black Sea Coast, the boats are equipped with motors as well as fully functional rigging. The number of passengers a gulette carries depends on the boat's size, although most of them accommodate between eight and twelve people. These vessels offer passengers separate accommodations, and chartering one includes services and entertainment. Modern gulettes are comfortably equipped with all of the amenities of home and encourage an environment in which



you are expected to do nothing but enjoy yourself. The closeness of the entourage on board promotes an atmosphere of friendship and sharing; relations between passengers and crew tend to be relaxed and casual.

Travel agencies can arrange charters and fixed tours for a specific group or for you individually. Unlike cruises on large ocean liners, on a gulette you can explore the secluded and often deserted bays and coves of the coastline. The small harbors and settlements offer an intimate view of coastal life which large ships simply cannot. In many ways a gulette is like a full-service hotel where every room has a sea view and the scenery changes constantly.



BARE-BOAT CHARTER AND FLOTILLA CRUISES: WHAT A WAY TO ROUGH IT!

Bare-boat charter has recently been introduced as another form of yacht hire in Turkey.

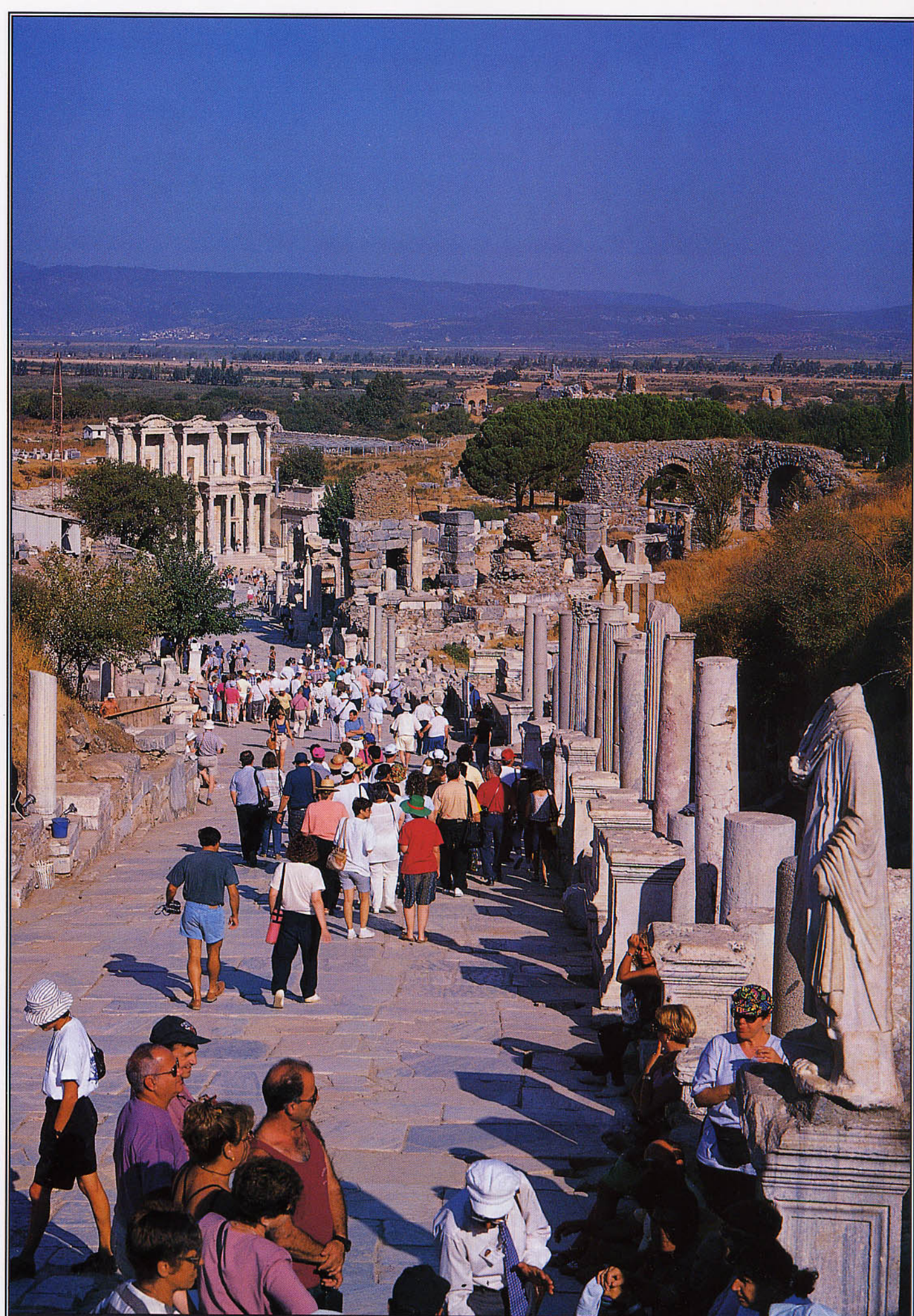


Maintenance crews keep these yachts in optimum condition, but it is the passengers themselves who crew the boat. The charters are undertaken by representatives who are responsible for putting the passengers on board, looking after them and seeing that they return safely to port. Of course, an experienced skipper accompanies the vessel, but once on board the people who undertake the charter perform all of the tasks - the handling of the sails, the seaman's chores, meal preparation and housekeeping. For those who want to escape all kitchen duties on their holiday, there is at least one restaurant at every anchorage, so eating out remains an option.



The more adventurous and experienced sailors can charter and pilot smaller (9- to 10-meter) motor yachts. Before setting sail, bare-boat companies generally brief their clients on the navigational characteristics of the environment, meteorological conditions, where and how to restock provisions, how to act in an emergency and any other pertinent information.

Flotilla sailing, or sailing with a group of yachts led by one boat, is another great adventure on the sea. Although an experienced sailor skippers the lead boat, the navigation of each individual boat is left to its crew.

SAILING TOURS

SAILING FROM İZMİR TO KUŞADASI: LIKE HOMER'S ODYSSEY

Known in Turkish as "Beautiful İzmir," the city lies at the head of a long and narrow gulf furrowed by ships and yachts.

The climate is mild, and in the summer the constant and refreshing sea breeze tempers the sun's heat. Behind the palm-lined promenades and avenues which follow the shoreline, the city, in horizontal terraces, gently ascends the slopes of the surrounding mountains. The art galleries, theaters and cultural events give this cosmopolitan city its special vibrancy. The original settlement was established in the third millennium BC and represented the most advanced culture in western Anatolia at that time. Through the centuries this thriving city and the surrounding area came under the sovereignty of Hittites, Ionians, Lydians, Persians, Byzantines, Seljuks and Ottomans.

Levent Marina provides an excellent place to begin a yachting adventure. Sailing in and around the beautiful Gulf of İzmir will prepare voyagers for the wonderful sites that lie ahead. At Urla Iskelesi (Urla Pier), the small islands that dot the coast will certainly charm you. Beautiful beaches and excellent moorings with swimming, snorkelling and diving are all available in the area.

From Urla Iskelesi sail on to the **Karaburun Peninsula**. At Karaburun, pleasant hotels, tea gardens and fish restaurants sit between the beautiful mountain backdrop and the clear, clean water. Voyage out of the Gulf of İzmir around the Karaburun Peninsula to the **Çeşme Peninsula**, a spit of land lapped by the waters of the Aegean Sea. Çeşme, ("fountain"), derives its name from the many sources of water found in

the area. A 14th-century Genoese fortress, restored and enlarged by the Ottomans in the 16th century, dominates the small port of **Çeşme**. Around Çeşme, the large **Altın Yunus Setur Marina** complex and the berthing places of Ilica and Dalyan are all noted for their safety. In town, the 16th-century caravanserai built by Süleyman the Magnificent near the fortress, has been converted into a hotel. Excellent shopping opportunities offer the finest quality carpets, leather goods, as well as souvenir items. At night, a lively, fun atmosphere pervades the port, especially in the restaurants, cafes, bars and discos along the promenade. In July, the Çeşme International Song Contest attracts world famous performers who add glamour and excitement to the town. The thermal baths in the area, along with the natural springs which mix with the sea water in Ilica Bay, provide soothing relaxation.

Southeast of Çeşme, beautiful bays offer splendid scenery and tranquil night moorings in complete safety from the winds and waves. Further along is **Sığacık**, where a picturesque marina rests beneath fortifications that date from the Genoese period. Conveniently close is the antique site of Teos, noted for its Temple of Dionysus, the god of wine. It is also an excellent area in which to sample some of the country's superb wines.

The **Kuşadası Gulf** spreads south and southeast with some of the most enticing beaches, bays and coves on the Aegean coast.

SAILING FROM KUŞADASI TO BODRUM: ST. JOHN'S HERITAGE REDISCOVERED

Kuşadası is a major holiday resort center that, during the summer months, teems with swimmers, fishermen, sunlovers and sightseers.

Once known as **Scala Nova**, the town boasts wonderful seafood restaurants, lively cafes, beautiful parks and superb beaches. The shopping is rich with everything from beads and bangles to leather, jewelry and carpets.

The **Kuşadası Setur Marina** is one of the best-equipped marinas in Turkey, with wintering capabilities for boats both afloat and on shore. Scuba diving has become very popular. The night life is renowned along the coast thanks to numerous bars, jazz clubs, discos and cabarets that promise evenings filled with excitement and entertainment.

Not far from Kuşadası, the ancient site of **Ephesus**, an important city of antiquity, remains a highlight of any visit to Turkey. The city, whose wealth and patronage supported its splendid architectural program, was dedicated to the goddess Artemis. Her enormous temple was rebuilt several times and was considered one of the Seven Wonders of the ancient world. The ancient theater there has found new life as a major concert venue. Nearby is the site of St. John's Basilica.

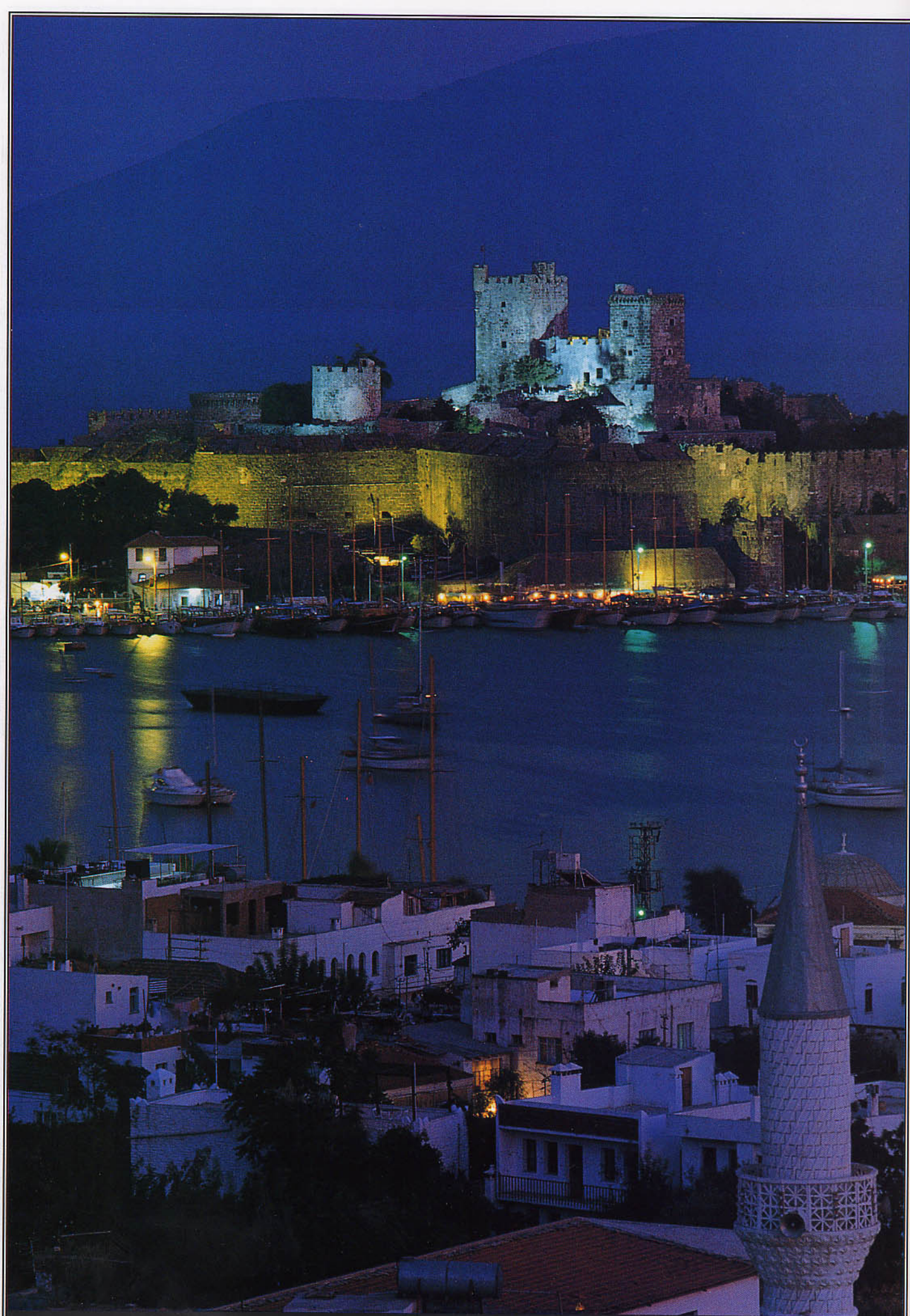
South of Kuşadası, the beautiful waters of the **Dilek Peninsula National Park** welcome

yachtsmen into its serene inlets and coves. Between Kuşadası's southern shores and Pamukkale lies the valley of the **Menderes River (the Meander)** where several ancient civilizations built major settlements, including **Priene, Miletus, Didyma (Didim), Aphrodisias** and **Hierapolis (Pamukkale)**. The Temple to Apollo at Didim was one of the most sacred places of antiquity. Though many times looted and burned, the sanctuary still possesses elegant beauty. Not far from this archeological site, the beautiful beach of **Altınkum** tempts visitors with sailing, swimming and relaxation. It is the last stop before entering the **Güllük Gulf**.

This gulf can provide a whole vacation in itself with four large natural bays and numerous coves and inlets. The whole area has excellent moorings, and scuba divers will be particularly interested in exploring these waters. The fisherman's village of **Güllük** has a pretty port and numerous guest-houses and small hotels. The mythological **Dolphin Boy** is said to have been born a little farther to the north at **Kıyıkşlacık (Iassos)**. As you sail out of this beautiful gulf, the **Bodrum Peninsula** comes into view.

SAILING FROM BODRUM TO MARMARIS: BLESSED WITH THE LOVE OF APHRODITE

Bodrum, on the north shore of the Gulf of Gökova, was the home of the first “Blue Voyager,” Cevat Şakir Kabaağaç or the “Fisherman of Halikarnas.”



It is the undisputed “hot-spot” of the Aegean Coast. This swinging, singing, dancing town, with its bohemian atmosphere, gathers together Turkey's artists, intellectuals and lovers of the good life.

An impressive medieval castle built by the Knights of Rhodes guards the entrance to Bodrum's dazzling blue bay, in which the Aegean and the Mediterranean Seas meet. The Bodrum Castle now houses the Museum of Underwater Archeology. Known in ancient times as **Halicarnassus**, Bodrum is the birthplace of Herodotus and the site of King Mausolus' Tomb (4th century BC), one of the Seven Wonders of the ancient world.

The yearly throng of visitors has encouraged small entrepreneurs who have made shopping in Bodrum a delight. Souvenirs abound, and on certain streets local artists gather to sell their works that come in all forms.

The **Bodrum Karada Marina** is one of the loveliest and best-equipped marinas in the region.

A yachting tour of the **Gulf of Gökova**



starts in Bodrum. The translucent and deep waters of the Gulf on the southern shore of the Bodrum Peninsula vary from the darkest blue to the palest turquoise, and the coastline is thickly wooded with every hue of green. In the evening, the sea reflects the mountains silhouetted against the setting sun, while at night it shimmers with phosphorescence.

One of the best anchorages is the splendidly scenic **Akbük**, hidden behind a forested promontory. The excellent cozy restaurants are as good a reason as any to linger for a tasty meal after an afternoon of snorkelling and diving. **Sedir Island (ancient Cedrai)** boasts an incredible beach with fine sand composed of fossils, and a splendid view of the **Kiran Mountains** across the bay. As you sail along the island's southwestern coast, forests stretch out to meet the deep inlets of the bays. The jagged coastline, known as the Bay of Sixty-Six Inlets, seems to have emerged from the oft-told tales of pirates.

The waters of the Gulf of Hisarönü lap the breathtaking shores that hold the legacy of

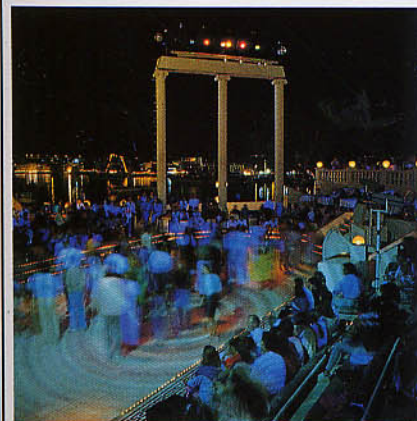
both ancient and modern civilizations. At the end of the **Datça Peninsula** stands the ancient Carian city of **Knidos**, described by Strabo as "a city that was built for the most beautiful of goddesses, Aphrodite, on the most beautiful of peninsulas." Famous as a center of art and culture in the fourth century BC, the city had two harbors, one on the Aegean and the other on the Mediterranean. The remains of a circular temple dedicated to the goddess of love overlook remains of the two harbors; the arcaded way was built of white marble heart-shaped columns. The legendary Aphrodite of Praxiteles statue, reputedly one of the most beautiful sculptures of antiquity, once graced this temple.

The town of **Datça** has become a popular stopover for yachtsmen, and offers many colorful seafood restaurants, pubs and discotheques.

In the Gulf of **Hisarönü** is the peaceful **Keçibükü Bay**. The **Bay Marina** is rich in natural beauty with the surrounding mountains and forests, and the long "**Kızıkkumu**," a natural sand formation. Leaving the Gulf of **Hisarönü**, hidden away in its own exclusive inlet is the town of **Bozburun**, famous as one of the guillette-building centers of Turkey. **Loryma**, at the tip of the **Bozburun Peninsula** where the ruins of the ancient harbor and castle remain, can only be reached by boat. **Kumlubük**, a turquoise paradise, lies on the southern side of the bay; on the north side, above the water, stands the ancient Rhodian city of **Amos**. At **Turunç** a natural harbor opens out into a wide expanse of spectacular blue water. The next port is **Marmaris**.

SAILING FROM MARMARIS TO FETHİYE: IN THE ROUTE OF ST. PAUL

Ancient Marmaris, Physkos, was an important stage on the Anatolia-Rhodes-Egypt trade route. In the 16th century, Süleyman the Magnificent had a citadel built on a hill just behind the harbor; today, it remains house the Marmaris Museum. Pine forests cover the mountains which surround Marmaris; on shore a white line of sand and rock separates green from blue. The beach areas sparkle, and provide visitors with a perfect opportunity to dive, snorkel and swim in relaxing conditions.

Yachts and boats decorate the coast of this lovely tourist center where thousands converge to enjoy a fun-filled, self-indulgent holiday. Those who surf and water ski will thrill at the possibilities in Marmaris. Energetic entertainment at a lively bar, or dancing until dawn at a sophisticated discotheque can end an ideal day.

There are many good buys in Marmaris boutiques, colorful bazaars and markets. You can find excellent leather and suede goods, copper and brassware, jewelry, and objects carved of onyx. Turkish carpets, textiles and embroidery make good handcrafted souvenirs, and the locally produced pine-scented honey called "çam balı" is superb.

The **Marmaris Netsel Marina**, one of the largest and best-equipped marinas in Turkey, and the **Marmaris Albatross Marina**, one of the best for wintering and maintaining yachts, make Marmaris an excellent starting point for the Blue Voyage tour of the Aegean Coast. In May, the Marmaris Yacht Charter Show provides an opportunity to meet the captains and their crews.



With plenty of provisions aboard, you set sail in the craft of your choice and languidly explore the spectacular beauty of southern Turkey.

At **Ekincik**, a delightful yacht-mooring, you can enjoy the breathtaking beauty of this area and the friendly hospitality of its people.

Delikli Island lies right off the coast, south-east of Ekincik. Yachtsmen enjoy a change of pace when they anchor at the island and take a smaller craft excursion into the **Dalyan Delta**. The Delta, with a long, golden, sandy beach at its mouth, is a nature-conservation area and a refuge for sea turtles (*Caretta caretta*) and blue crabs. At a bend in the river, high on the cliff face above the fascinating ancient harbor-city of Caunos, magnificent tombs were carved into the rock. From Delikli Island, sailing southeast, you arrive at **Sangerme** with its pleasant holiday complexes, nestled in cozy pine forests. Yachtsmen will want to anchor at **Baba Island**, across from the pristine sandy beaches.

The **Gulf of Göcek**, with the friendly **Club Marina** set in a beautiful pine forest, is one of the Mediterranean's best sailing spots. Dotted with islands and indented with many coves, its land and seascapes are irresistible. The ruins of **Arymaxa**, an ancient city at the southern tip of the gulf, lie at the edge of the azure waters. Opposite on **Tersane Island** stand Byzantine ruins including those of the ancient shipyards. From the Gulf of Göcek sail on into Fethiye.

FROM FETHİYE TO KAŞ: A LYCIAN DREAM

The resort town of Fethiye has an important marina and overlooks a beautiful bay strewn with islands.

The secrets of the ancient gods of mythology still lie hidden in the secluded coves and bays around the **Gulf of Fethiye**. This is truly paradise for those who want to sail through history.

Above the town, called **Telmessos** in antiquity, numerous Lycian rock tombs reproducing the facades of ancient buildings were cut into the cliff face. Explore the **Belceğiz Bay** and the beautiful **Blue Lagoon (Ölüdeniz)**, where the calm, crystal-clear water is ideal for swimming and other water sports. On **Gemiler Island**, Byzantine ruins lie tucked among the pines.

Go ashore at **Kimik** (65 km from Fethiye) where the ruins of **Xanthos**, the ancient Lycian capital, lie in a splendid natural setting. At the holy Lycian center of **Letoon**, three temples dedicated to Leto, Apollo

and Artemis, familiar gods of mythology, await the intrepid tourist. Mythology records that Apollo was born at **Patara**, a principal harbor of ancient **Lycia**, south of Letoon and Xanthos. The ruins are, of course, numerous and fascinating. Its 22 kilometers of pure white sand stretch as far as the eye can see, making it a natural choice for all types of beach sports.

A short sail to the east brings you to **Kalkan**, a small, lovely hilltop town that overlooks a tiny bay. Narrow, winding streets lined with souvenir shops lead down to the charming marina. Every morning, boats busily take tourists to one of the nearby beaches or small bays. As the sun sets, it is Kalkan style to meet on the roof terraces for a drink before dinner, and enjoy the comings and goings of the yachts, the business of the marina and the panoramic view.

FROM KAŞ TO ANTALYA: DOLPHINS' PLAYGROUND

Like most towns on the Lycian coast, Kaş lies wedged between mountains and sea. Kaş (ancient Antiphellus) still exhibits a few remains of the old settlement. An ancient theater on the long Kaş Peninsula is within walking distance of the town.

Kekova, "home of the sun," is an island an hour from **Dalyanagzı** (ancient **Andriace**) by sea, as well as the name of a whole ensemble of picturesque islands with numerous bays and ancient cities. These bays provide natural harbors in all seasons, and yachtsmen particularly enjoy exploring the unspoiled landscapes. Along the northern shore of **Kekova Island**, at **Apollonia**, earthquakes once disturbed the land causing some of the ancient houses to sink under the clear water, creating a sunken city. **Kaleköy Castle** (ancient **Simena**) offers a bird's-eye view of the bays, inlets, islands and colorful yachts sailing peacefully on the glassy water. Kekova has the blue skies and orange sunsets of a Van Gogh painting, along with starry nights, peace and tranquillity, playful dolphins, mythological mysteries, and the sparkling sea - all this and more.

At **Demre (Kale)**, the ancient **Myra**, (25 km west of Finike), many splendid carved-rock tombs overlook the magnificent

Roman theater. St. Nicholas was the bishop of this Mediterranean city during the fourth century and died here in 342. Finike is an official entry-port and is surrounded by citrus trees and gardens. Thirty-two kilometers from the **Finike Marina** are the remains of the beautiful and ancient Lycian city of **Arikanda**. A mountain trek inland rewards you with superb views, fabulous ruins and fresh mountain air.

Slipping around the **Kırlangıç Peninsula** brings you into the **Gulf of Antalya**. The first sight you come to is the ancient city of **Olympos**, on the southern side of **Mt. Tahtalı** (Mt. Olympos). Oleander and laurel bushes shade the **Olympos Valley**, which you can approach by land as well as by sea. Nearby at **Yanartaş** (at a height of 300 meters), the mythological Lycian hero Bellerophon mounted his winged horse Pegasus and slew the fire-breathing Chimaera. Gas seeping from the earth and burning brightly at night give the place an

ethereal appearance. The favorite winter resort of Alexander the Great was **Phaselis**, the ancient commercial harbor north of Olympus. South of the harbor you can look up at Mt. Tahtalı for a spectacular view. Sail on to Kemer, a resort town carefully designed to blend in with the surrounding scenery, for an ideal environment for a wonderful holiday. The fully equipped **Park Kemer Marina** has facilities for all activities and yachtsmen can enjoy the unspoiled bays and beaches south of the town. Shoppers will be delighted by the wonderful range of high-quality souvenirs. April is the month of the colorful Kemer Carnival. Also in the spring are the yacht races between Kemer and Girne, in the Turkish Republic of Northern Cyprus. Sailing around this coast towards Antalya will give you a glimpse of some of Turkey's most modern and luxurious holiday vil-



lages. **Antalya**, Turkey's principal holiday resort city on the Mediterranean, embodies the contrast between the majestic coastline of beaches and rocky coves, and the towering Taurus Mountains. Here the ancient **Attelia**, named after King Attalus II of Pergamum, was founded in the 2nd century BC. Today palm-lined boulevards, beautiful parks, historical buildings, monuments, museum and picturesque old quarter of **Kaleiçi**, (with the **Kaleiçi Marina**) blend together to create an ideal holiday atmosphere. The Antalya Marina and Leisure Center, which has won several awards, is considered one of the most beautiful marinas in Turkey. **Setur Antalya Marina**, is, on the other hand, quiet and peaceful, but both will welcome you after an unforgettable voyage in the turquoise paradise of Turkey's water.

SOME REGULATIONS ON USING FOREIGN-OWNED YACHTS IN TURKISH WATERS AND LEAVING THEM IN TURKISH MARINAS

TURKEY WILL BE ON YOUR YACHT'S ROUTE

You can charter a crewed or bareboat yacht in Turkey, or you can come to Turkey on your own yacht.

Please refer to Turkish Embassy or consulates in your country to find out whether or not you are subject to visa requirement in accordance with Turkey's reciprocity schedule for your nationality.

WELCOME TO TURKEY

All yachts are required to enter and leave Turkey through the border gates.

BORDER GATES OF TURKEY: Hopa, Rize, Trabzon, Giresun, Ordu, Samsun, Inebolu, Sinop, Bartın, Zonguldak, Ereğli İstanbul, Tekirdağ, Derince, Gemlik, Mudanya, Bandırma, Çanakkale, Akçay, Ayvalık, Dikili, İzmir, Kuşadası, Didim, Güllük, Bodrum, Datça, Marmaris, Fethiye, Kaş, Finike, Kemer, Antalya, Alanya, Anamur, Boz-yazi, Taşucu, Mersin, Botaş, İskenderun.

ENTERING TURKEY

If you want to enter Turkey coming from international harbors and waters; you are required to obtain a Yacht Registration Certificate and fill out this certificate, which includes information about yachts and yachters, as shown in instructions and to complete Customs, Passport, Coast Welfare and Harbor procedures that are in consistence with international regulations and subject to your declaration.

Yacht Registration Fee: 30 US Dollars.

Validity period of Yacht Registration Certificate is one year. However, in the event that owner of the yacht changes or yacht goes out of Turkish Customs Zone or in case of the loss of Yacht Registration Certificate, certificate's validity period expires. In such cases, it is possible to obtain a new yacht registration certificate.

YOUR CRUISES BETWEEN TURKISH HARBORS IN TURKISH TERRITORIAL WATERS

You as a yacht owner and your guests on board are allowed to cruise between the harbors in Turkish territorial waters, as long as it is with the purpose of traveling, sports and entertainment, not for commercial purposes.

In your cruise, as long as there is no change in captain, crew or yachtsman, you can voyage to other bays on your route, excluding forbidden zones, without further procedures.

In the event that there occurs a change of captain, yachtsman, crew or your route, you must certainly refer to the Harbor Director and have the change approved.

Yachts owned by more than one person, foreign flagged private yachts and yachts that belong to associations, federations or clubs can be used by a maximum of four owners in a year.

If you are in our country with your yacht and you want to extend your visa period; you can extend your visa period by declaring a Ministry of Tourism approved yacht harbor or a yacht docking area as your address. In that ca-

se your residence and visa period can be at most five years in connection with the mooring contract you signed with yacht harbor or yacht docking area.

You can also use your private car in Turkey during your residence and visa period, by informing Customs Directorate.

If you want to leave Turkey temporarily by your yacht, you can leave your land vehicle, if any, at the places that are in customs supervision.

If it is needed that you or your family be taken to or be brought from another harbor, your captain, upon your written or faxed directive, with the sailing permission of Harbor Directorate, can use your yacht for round-trip from one harbor to another Turkish harbor when it is empty, without taking any guests or yachters.

Unless there is a complaint or informing duly placed against you regarding carrying contraband, a search or property inspection in your yacht cannot be made.

However, if it's found that you carry merchandise that is illegal to bring into Turkey, by your declaration or an informing placed, this merchandise is put into customs supervision and it is not returned until you leave Turkey.

In case of urgent entering and leavings due to cases of emergency, unforeseen events or obligations arise from the Law regarding Securing Life and Property in Sea, a declaration about the situation is required to be made to the Turkish Authorities in first place arrived.

DIVING REGIONS

All kinds of equipped diving are subject to permission in Turkish Waters. For more information and diving regions please contact City Tourism Directorate and Advisory Directorate.

CHANGES IN THE YACHT INVENTORY LIST

In case of a change in your yacht's original inventory for any reason (repair etc), during the time period your yacht is in Turkey, necessary changes on the Yacht Registrati-

on Certificate will be made by Customs Officer.

Spare parts and other equipment of your yacht can stay in Turkey as long as your yacht is in Turkey.

In the event that you want to take the repairs and maintenance spare parts out of Turkey Customs Zone, they should be recorded in the Inventory List of the yacht. Also according to the 164th article of Customs Law, numbered 4458, you can leave old spare parts at Customs Directorate.

LEAVING YACHTS IN TURKISH MARINAS

Foreign flagged yachts can be left in Turkey up to 5 years without a need for permission; provided that yacht sail at least once in every 2 years by the owner.

During those periods you can leave your yacht at a Ministry of Tourism licensed yacht harbor or yacht docking area and leave the country.

LEAVING THE COUNTRY

While going to International Harbors from Turkish harbors the relevant section of the Yacht Registration Certificate should be completed and it should be certified by Harbor Director. Then you can complete the leaving procedures at Customs Directorate.

RESPONSIBILITIES

1. It's unlawful to use your private yacht for commercial purposes without the permission of Ministry of Tourism.
2. It's unlawful to collect money for the yacht tours from the persons initially stated as guests.
3. Any statement not in accordance with the truth will require legal action.
4. Taking historical artifacts out of Turkey is a crime and will require legal action.
5. It's unlawful to buy inventory from other yachts and ships which hadn't completed customs processes.

We would like to remind that, these undertakings are unlawful according to International and Turkish laws, legal action will be taken in accordance with Republic of Turkey laws.
